## URBAN EXPLORER'S HANDBOOK 2007: YOU ARE HERE

*Creative Loafing's* third annual guide to the city maps out the best things to see and do

ATLANTA — Just 10 years ago, Atlanta residents and visitors would have been hard-pressed to visit as many notable restaurants, attractions, nightclubs and bars listed in this year's Urban Explorer's Handbook, which hit streets Thursday, March 29. The reason: They simply didn't exist.

For this year's Urban Explorer's Handbook, however, not only is there quantity, the quality of destinations matches it. As metro Atlanta's premier resource for what to explore in the city, it makes sense that *Creative Loafing* has provided a special section "packed with information about places to go and things to do, as well as how to do them," says *CL* Editor Ken Edelstein. "I don't think there's ever been such a comprehensive guide to what's cool in the city."

The 64-page full-color issue features 15 neighborhood maps, hundreds of heavily researched listings, stories about various intown areas such as Midtown and the Westside, quotes from well-known Atlanta residents and business owners, and the colorful, striking images of *CL* Staff Photographer Joeff Davis.

In addition, the Cityscape part of the Urban Explorer's Handbook guides readers to getting around the city, whether on MARTA or other public transit; into Atlanta, with a calendar of festivals, ways to volunteer or join a kickball team; and out of the metro area, with "Georgia's wild side: Seven great places to escape and challenge yourself."
